



**First Church in Ludlow**

**APRIL 2017**

**FROM THE PASTOR:**

Congregationalist, Public Worship, and Town Meeting.

In 1774, the first church in Ludlow, later named The First Congregational Church, and renamed The First Church in Ludlow, was constituted in order that the township could be formed. This may not seem like a reason to form a congregation but in 18<sup>th</sup> Century New England, by law, there could not be a township without a church. In most cases, it had to be a Congregational church.

The town and the congregation were the same people. It was expected that everyone would attend public worship. In some locations, attendance at public worship was required by local ordinance. The people of the town, the congregation, would build a “Meeting House” in the town square. The Meeting House served a dual purpose, the place for public worship and the place to hold town meetings.

We Congregationalist are the people of the “Meeting House.” The business of the congregation was the business of the town. In the town meeting, the finances of the church were voted upon. In some New England towns, as recently as 2007, the town voted upon the church budget given the original charter of church and town, until amended.

So, when questions come up about combining our Annual Business Meeting with worship, in the worship space, we Congregationalist have been doing that since the mid 1600’s. For those not familiar with Congregationalism and some of its peculiar ways, combining worship with “business” may seem a bit odd or even offensive.

But Congregationalist have always understood that this is God’s world, all of it, and that it is our responsibility to manage it responsibly, all of it, worship, finances, the environment, civic relationships, and government.

We see all space as sacred space. The “Meeting House” is not sacred because of the building itself, it is made sacred when folks meet in it. The meeting of folks in it is what makes the building sacred, not the building itself. The space is made sacred by the meeting.

So, when we do worship and the business of the congregation in the same hour, in the same space, we are reaffirming our Congregational roots.

The Town of Ludlow continued to use the “Meeting House” as a Town Hall and a Place of Worship until 1833.

We have some volunteers who will put the signs up and even collect them after so that we can re-use them next year.



April 9th Easter Egg Hunt - Volunteers ?


April 16th Easter (no Class)


